As they explore the dynamic interplay between Chinese and Western traditions, students cultivate a global mindset, sharpen critical thinking, and strengthen communication skills.

In the Classroom

Our Global Perspective students benefit from engaging, high-quality academic experiences. Whether collaborating with Chinese and international peers or pursuing independent projects in state-of-the-art STEM labs, students are guided by experienced educators in a vibrant learning environment.

Chinese language instruction is deeply rooted in cultural immersion. Our curriculum emphasizes practical skills — listening, speaking, reading, and writing — while integrating rich cultural content. Tailored to each student's proficiency level, lessons include:

- Chinese character exploration
- Classical literature appreciation
- Traditional clothing and tea culture
- Chinese music and rhythm

Beyond the Classroom

Outside the classroom, students engage in a wide array of sports, including rugby, rowing, netball, tennis, swimming, soccer, volleyball, basketball, and table tennis. These activities foster teamwork, resilience, and cross-cultural collaboration.

Students also participate in curated company visits and cultural excursions. In 2024, our UAE cohort visited the A.I. Future World Institute, where they designed robots in hands-on workshops and competed in innovation challenges. A visit to an automated electric vehicle factory offered firsthand insight into China's cutting-edge manufacturing sector.

Boarding life adds another layer of enrichment. Students enjoy authentic Chinese cuisine, traditional board games, and shared living experiences that build independence, discipline, and lifelong friendships.

Exploring Beyond Academic Boundaries

True to our philosophy of Education Beyond the Classroom, students embark on academic excursions to cultural landmarks such as museums, classical gardens, and historical sites. Activities include:

- Traditional tea ceremonies
- Shadow puppetry workshops
- Discussions on global topics with Chinese peers



Global Impact & Innovation in Action

In the summer of 2024, WAS marked a significant milestone in its Global Perspective programme, welcoming 90 aspiring leaders from the United Arab Emirates and 30 students from Thailand to its campuses in Changzhou and Hangzhou. These students engaged in bespoke academic classes, developed STEM projects in cutting - edge DT labs, and immersed themselves in Chinese cultural experiences.

A highlight of the programme was the visit to Taihu Lake, where students drew inspiration for future water system designs—blending environmental awareness with innovation. This initiative not only enriched student learning but also strengthened WAS's strategic partnerships with foreign governments and educational agents. Looking ahead, we are committed to expanding our global network and fostering deeper international collaboration.

Immersive Learning Experiences	
Chinese Storytelling	Explores classic and contemporary Chinese stories through narration and drama, helping students appreciate the language while gaining insight into cultural values.
Chinese Culture Festival	A thematic exploration of a traditional Chinese festival, brought to life through interactive activities, food experiences, and cultural customs.
Chinese Culture: 24 Solar Terms	An introduction to China's ancient 24-term solar calendar, highlighting its relevance to traditional farming practices, seasonal food, and wellbeing.
Chinese Culture: Tea	Covers the history, philosophy, and etiquette of Chinese tea culture, often including a demonstration or guided tea-tasting experience.
Chinese Culture: Calligraphy	An introductory session on Chinese brush calligraphy, focusing on basic strokes, structure, and the artistic expression of written characters.
Chinese Art: Sachet Making	A hands-on workshop where students create traditional embroidered sachets, learning about symbolic patterns and the use of herbs.
Chinese Art: Mask Painting	An artistic activity inspired by Chinese opera, in which students paint masks while learning about colour symbolism and character representation.
Chinese Costume: Hanfu	An introduction to Hanfu (traditional Han Chinese attire), exploring its historical development, styles, and cultural significance.
Chinese Drama	A drama-based workshop using role-play and performance techniques to explore Chinese stories, language use, and cultural contexts.
Chinese Choir	Students learn and rehearse Chinese songs in a choir setting, supporting language development, musical appreciation, and teamwork.
Chinese Food: Dumpling Making	A practical cooking workshop where participants learn to prepare traditional Chinese dumplings from scratch.
Camp Carnival	A lively, festival-style event featuring games, performances, and social activities designed to build community and camp spirit.
Camp Olympics	A series of team-based sports and fun competitions that promote cooperation, resilience, and healthy competition.
STEM	An engaging, hands-on module designed to spark scientific curiosity and develop problem-solving skills through interdisciplinary projects. Activities and difficulty levels are carefully tailored to students' ages, interests, and the overall programme schedule.

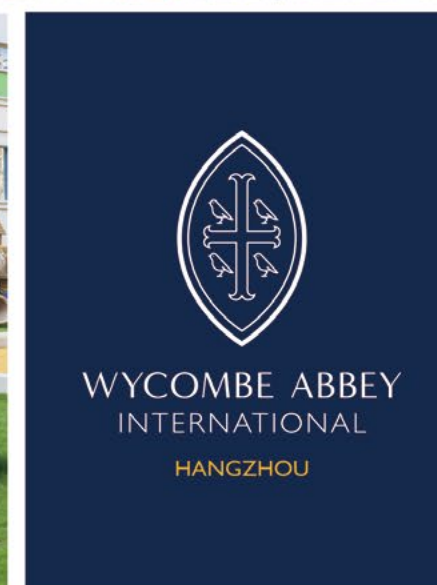

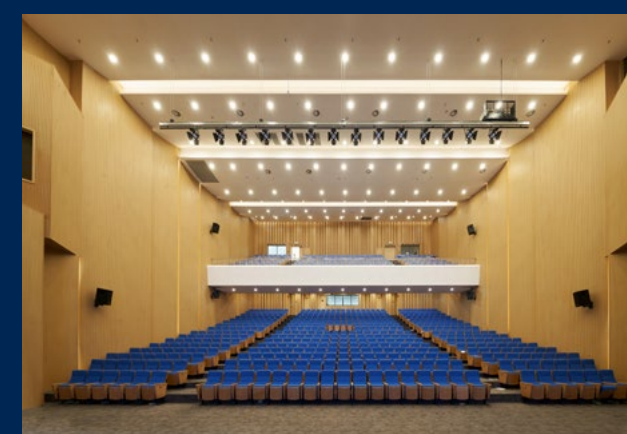

Founded in 2021, Wycombe Abbey School Nanjing is located on a 20-acre campus in the scenic Tangshan area of Jiangning District, just 20 km east of downtown Nanjing and adjacent to the Tangshan Hot Spring Resort. As a fast - developing zone in eastern Nanjing, Tangshan offers excellent infrastructure in education, healthcare, commerce, and transport — making it an ideal setting for a world-class school.

The campus features a unique fusion of Eastern and Western architecture, including a transplanted ancestral temple from Jiangxi Province, now serving as the Chinese Cultural Centre. Students engage in traditional arts such as calligraphy, painting, and tea ceremonies, enriching their cultural understanding.

- A Sports Centre with indoor gyms, a 25 - meter swimming pool, and outdoor courts

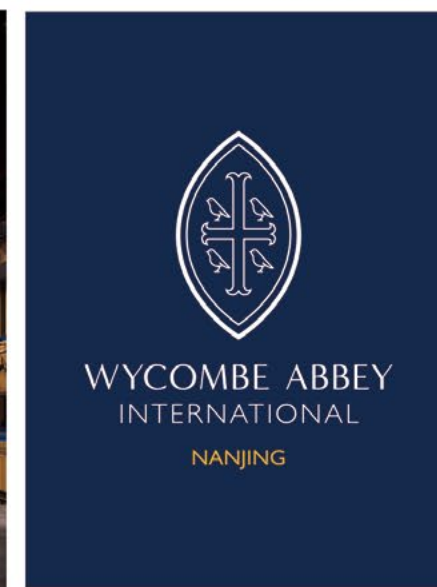
This immersive environment fosters both academic achievement and personal growth.
